

Underage Drinking is Widespread in Washington

- Approximately 231,000 underage youth in Washington drink each year. In self-reporting by WA students grades 9-12:
- 73% had at least one drink of alcohol.
- 17% had their first drink other than a sip, before age 13.
- 43% had at least one drink in the past 30 days.
- 26% had five or more drinks in a row in the past 2 weeks.

Facts on Youth and Alcohol

- In the United State alone, alcohol kills more kids than all illegal drugs combined.
- Each day, more than 7000 kids in the United States under the age of 16 take their first drink.
- Girls are now drinking at the same rate as boys.
- Teen girls who binge drink are up to 63% more likely to become teen mothers.

Why Do Kids Drink?

- Peer pressure
- To be cool
- To escape
- Because "everyone" does it!
- Because of family influence
- Television/Movies

- It is the "safe" drug
- It is cheap and "easy" to get
- It lowers their inhibitions
- They believe it raises their self-confidence
- It is a "rite of passage"

Why Focus Enforcement Efforts on Underage Drinking? Top 10 Reasons

- #10 Reason: Underage drinking is a crime
- #9 Reason: Underage drinking is a nuisance
- #8 Reason: Underage drinking is bad business
- #7 Reason: Underage drinking is epidemic
- #6 Reason: Enforcement of underage drinking laws may deter youth from committing more serious crimes as an adult and even as a youthful offender

Why Focus Enforcement Efforts on Underage Drinking? Top 10 Reasons

- **#5 Reason**: Underage drinking has tragic results [i.e. alcohol poisoning, sexual assault, assault, unintentional injuries, etc.]
- #4 Reason: Underage drinking costs lives...an average of 13 youth per day
- **#3 Reason**: Underage drinking costs YOU resources! [i.e. manpower, money, etc.]
- #2 Reason: Underage drinking impacts the community. Did you know that 80% of the costs of underage drinking is due to crime? Of particular interest is that 40% of violent crimes by youth and 24% of property crimes by youth involve alcohol use

Why Focus Enforcement Efforts on Underage Drinking? Top 10 Reasons

#1 Reason: Active enforcement of underage drinking laws will ultimately reduce calls to service and reduce crime and tragedies in your community.

So What's The Answer?

- A "Champion" is necessary
- Youth need to request enforcement of UAD and support their efforts
- Youth coalitions need to work in partnership with enforcement agencies
- Community resources are plentiful
- Cooperative action is needed to improve and enforce alcohol related laws.

Why Get Involved? (I have too much to do as it is!)

- It is "Pro-Active"
- Underage drinking is against the LAW!
- It can prevent tragedy
- It provides variety to law enforcement duty
- Overtime opportunities for enforcement (grants)
