



Attributes of a productive comment

- Reference the specific WAC section or subsection to which your comment pertains
- Specific and substantive
- Focus on the solution, not feelings
- Suggest actual substitute rule language rather than general concern
- Possibly draws upon research (with citation)
- Respond to draft rule: what do you like, don't like, what would you change and WHY
